Skills for Psychological Recovery (SPR) is an evidence-informed intervention that is intended to foster intermediate and long-term adaptive coping in disaster survivors who are exhibiting moderate levels of distress, by offering simplified, brief application of skills that are commonly related to improved recovery in post-disaster/emergency settings. Developed by The National Child Traumatic Stress Network and the National Center for PTSD, SPR is intended to follow the acute implementation of Psychological First Aid, by supporting long-term resiliency in children, adolescents and adults.
